

This course offers training in the knowledge and skills needed to become a certified Emergency Medical Technician - Basic (OH-109). Course curriculum includes didactic and practical instruction in critical thinking skills, crisis intervention, emergency scene management, proper recognition and management of medical emergencies, trauma patient care and general ambulance operations.

The program is accredited by the State of Ohio Division of EMS (ODPS Accreditation #109) and will prepare students for certification by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians (NREMT).

Tuition includes the state EMT practice test, AHA Basic Life Support CPR training, all course books, clinical fees, insurance coverage, uniform shirt and the NREMT exam fee (for one attempt).




An American Heart Association (AHA) Instructor Essentials course teaches the methods needed to effectively instruct others in resuscitation courses.

Direct Loans: Student loans must be repaid. Repayment starts 6 months after completing or withdrawing from the program. Students withdrawing who receive Federal Financial Aid may not be eligible for all funding that was scheduled. Calculations will be made using the Return of Title IV Funds policy, which is mandated by the U.S. Department of Education. Students may end up owing money out of pocket to Cuyahoga Valley Career Center. The Financial Aid office will process Workforce Innovation and Op-portunity Act (WIOA) funding and scholarships. Students that withdraw after the first day of class or are dismissed due to poor academic performance or attendance will be evaluated to see if they are eligible for a prorated refund of their tuition.
