

Using the students' blueprints, Construction Trades juniors brought the design to life. Throughout the process, both groups collaborated to tackle design challenges as they arose. The AMD students revised their plans based on feedback, reflecting the kind of real-world teamwork and problem-solving found in the industry every day. The final structure was built at CVCC, then taken apart and transported to the IX Center, where it was reassembled for display at the Home and Remodeling Expo. The project was a great success, offering students valuable insight into the design-build process from start to finish. Empowering the Future: CVCC Partners with ConnectedHR for AI in HR Training Through Ohio TechGrant


