

"Working at the Oaks taught me how to build relationships, communicate effectively with different people, and adapt to a variety of situations," she said.

To students considering CVCC, Emilee offers this advice: "There will always be someone more experienced or skilled than you, but success comes from confidence, dedication, and a willingness to grow.
