




CVCC Attends Nuts & Bolts Bash

Building Career Readiness at Nordonia High School



Nordonia High School Hosts Career Spotlight Event



The guest speaker, Stefanie Scali-Smith, Human Resources Generalist at Cleveland Clinic Akron General Hospital, shared valuable insights into managing employee relations in a large healthcare organization. Students learned about her role in addressing workplace challenges such as theft, misconduct, social media use, performance management, harassment, bullying, and substance abuse. The presentation provided an informative look at the business and human resources side of hospital operations.



Experiencing Health Careers Firsthand at CVCC

On November 17, students in the Health Careers class at Nordonia High School visited Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (CVCC) with support from Career Specialist, Deb Monaco. During their visit, they learned about CVCC's Health Careers program from Mr. Zana's senior students, who shared insights into coursework, clinical experiences, and potential career paths. Students participated in a hands-on nail care simulation, practicing sanitizing, soaking, cleaning, and filing nails to gain a better understanding of the skills required for a Certified Nursing Assistant. They also explored the Sports Medicine Exercise Science program through a sprained-ankle rehabilitation activity. Working in teams, students researched techniques to improve stability and mobility and presented their strategies to classmates. The field trip offered an immersive, real-world look at health careers, allowing students to practice professional skills and gain valuable career insights.













November Brought Exciting Career Exploration to Richfield Elementary and Revere High School

In November, there was much career exploration and engagement at Richfield Elementary School and Revere High School! Kindergarteners celebrated their first-ever Career Week, hearing from parents about their fascinating jobs. Students learned how civil engineers are helping construct the new Cleveland Browns stadium, how detectives work to keep communities safe, and how an ER doctor and nurse collaborate to treat patients. They even had fun practicing dance steps with a Ballroom Dance teacher and children's program coordinator, all while exploring a variety of exciting careers. First graders also enjoyed Career Day highlights, including learning about life as a published author, exploring the many careers working with animals through the Humane Society of Summit County, and discovering how a neonatal nurse practitioner cares for newborns and their moms.

On November 25, 21 high school students attended the Cleveland Clinic's virtual inschool field trip, "Heroes of the Hospital: Nursing Careers," to learn about the diverse opportunities in nursing. Live speakers included a Nurse Midwife, an Operating Room RN, a Nurse Practitioner, and a Nurse's Aide. CVCC Career Specialist for the Revere School District, Nancy Vondrak, noted that this virtual field trip had the largest student participation since Revere High School began participating in the Cleveland Clinic's Connected Career Rounds programs several years ago. Exploring Medical Careers: North Royalton Students Learn from Healthcare Professionals

North Royalton AP Anatomy and Biology students recently had the chance to learn directly from a variety of medical professionals who visited to share their expertise and experiences. Coordinated by the CVCC Career Specialist for the district, Jill Larson, the guest speakers included a cardiac nurse, a pediatric radiologist, a scrub nurse on a liver transplant team, a respiratory therapist, a registered nurse, an occupational therapist, and a pharmacist. Each professional discussed their daily responsibilities, the challenges and rewards of their work, and the educational paths that led them to their careers. The presentations provided a meaningful learning experience, sparking curiosity and giving students a clearer picture of potential future careers in the medical field. This event not only broadened students' knowledge but also inspired many to explore opportunities in health sciences.





Twinsburg School District Building Foundation for Career Exploration

In Twinsburg, career development took center stage last month as sixth graders at Dodge Intermediate School were introduced to the Holland Personality Codes (RIASEC model). CVCC Career Specialist for the district, Toni Cluse, led the lesson, helping students understand how their personal interests and strengths can connect to potential career paths. As part of Career Week activities, students explored a variety of unique careers during morning presentations, expanding their awareness of the many professional opportunities available. Twinsburg juniors and seniors (also enrolled at CVCC) also visited to share their own career journeys and future goals. These interactions not only inspired younger students but also gave high school students a chance to practice public speaking and showcase their experiences. By introducing the Holland Codes and providing career spotlights, the district is laying a strong foundation for students to begin thinking about their futures and preparing to engage with professionals at career fairs and more.





Twinsburg High School Celebrates Career Week with Hands-On Experiences and College Opportunities

From November 10–14, Twinsburg High School (THS) hosted its annual Career Week, offering a variety of engaging activities to help students explore future pathways and connect classroom learning to real-world possibilities. 
