## CVCC Team Earns Third at SkillsUSA Regional TeamWorks Competition

On Friday, January 30, two CVCC Construction Trades teams showcased their skills at the SkillsUSA Northeast Regional TeamWorks Competition, held during the Great Big Home and Garden Show at the I-X Center.

The competition challenges teams of four to collaborate on building a detailed project, demonstrating expertise in carpentry, roofing, electrical work, plumbing, and masonry. Teams must interpret a complex blueprint, follow special instructions from a pre-competition orientation, and develop a project completion plan to present to the judges. Judging criteria include presentation skills, adherence to building codes, jobsite safety and cleanliness, material organization, tool management, and overall project completion.

Our senior Construction Trades team—Anthony Grissman (Cuyahoga Heights High School), Anthony Marino (TRECA), Will Bernatovicz (Revere High School), and Joe Rozak (Revere High School)—earned third place and will advance to the state competition in Columbus this May. Congratulations gentlemen, and best of luck!

High school students interested in computing and higher education had the opportunity to ask questions and learn about:


- Careers and pathways in Computer Science

## Local Engineer Inspires Nordonia Students with STEM Career Journey

On February 19, Nordonia students had the opportunity to explore real-world STEM careers during a special classroom presentation coordinated by Deb Monaco, CVCC Career Specialist for the Nordonia School District. Guest speaker Sarah Paris, a Senior Project Engineer with Swagelok, shared insights from her professional journey in engineering, education, and manufacturing.

Paris discussed her academic background and hands-on experience in the manufacturing industry, highlighting how she works to improve production processes and develop training programs that support innovation and emerging technologies. Her presentation emphasized the wide range of STEM skills involved in modern manufacturing and how engineering principles are applied beyond the classroom. Adding a personal connection for students, Paris explained that prior to joining Swagelok, she served as a mathematics teacher at Nordonia High School. Her transition from education to engineering illustrated the flexibility of career pathways and the value of strong foundational skills in math and science.

Students were especially engaged as they learned about new and evolving technologies shaping today's manufacturing workforce. The presentation offered a firsthand look at STEM careers and underscored the importance of adaptability, lifelong learning, and pursuing professional interests.
