We're so proud of their dedication and can't wait to see them represent CVCC on the national stage!





CVCC Becomes First Career-Technical Education School Invited to Safe Smiles

The Safe Smiles program in Cleveland, organized by the Greater Cleveland Dental Society, is a community initiative dedicated to promoting oral health and preventing sports-related dental injuries. The program provides free, custom-fitted mouth guards to local high school football players in a supportive, educational environment. This year marked a special milestone, as Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (CVCC) was the first career and technical school invited to participate in Safe Smiles. Our senior Dental Assisting students had the incredible opportunity to work alongside dental students under the supervision of Greater Cleveland Dental Society members and residents from area programs.

The event, held at Willoughby South High School on Saturday, February 28, began with an orientation. During this session, Dr. Tom Coreno and Dr. Sam Taylor reviewed proper impression techniques, what constitutes an accurate impression, and the various types of mouth guards available to athletes. This discussion reinforced the important role dental assistants play in patient education, especially when helping patients understand their options for protecting their teeth during sports activities. Over 70 student-athletes from Charles F. Brush High School, Kirtland High School, and Willoughby South High School arrived, with 8–10 stations set up for efficient workflow. Representing CVCC were seniors Olivia Albrecht (Twinsburg High School), Holly Gayner (Revere High School), Isaiah Kirkpatrick (Twinsburg High School), Simar Laly (Twinsburg High School), Lily Sobieski (Nardon High School), Elizabeth Werner (North Royalton High School), and Diana Zgurska (North Royalton High School), along with Ms. Theodore. Throughout the day, students evaluated mouth sizes for trays, mixed alginate, maintained organized workspaces, and successfully took impressions for athletes participating in local flag football teams.

The program, led by Dr. Tom Coreno and Dr. Sam Taylor, also provided an opportunity to collaborate with area employers who support the CVCC Dental Assisting program. Our seniors had a fun-filled, hands-on learning experience and demonstrated exceptional professionalism. Feedback from organizers and participants was overwhelmingly positive—many commented on how professional and impressive the students were and expressed enthusiasm about having CVCC return to participate again next year. Thank you to the Safe Smiles program for providing CVCC with this incredible opportunity!



Health Careers and Dental Assisting Collaborate to Build Skills

CVCC Health Careers and Dental Assisting juniors recently partnered to strengthen their clinical skills and gain hands-on healthcare experience. During the session, Health Careers students demonstrated proper techniques for measuring blood pressure, including correct placement of the cuff, adjusting the valve, inflating the cuff, and accurately reading results using a stethoscope. Following the demonstration, students practiced these skills with one another, building confidence, reinforcing teamwork, and preparing for future careers in the healthcare field. This collaborative experience highlighted the value of peer learning and real-world application in career-technical education.



Culinary Students Welcome Preschoolers for a Sweet Experience

On March 10, CVCC's Culinary Arts & Hospitality Management students welcomed some very special guests from Independence Co-Op Preschool for a Chef for a Day experience. 


CVCC Adult Education Attends NATE UNITE Conference

Professional-to-Student Experience at Bissell Elementary



Building Professional Resumes at Twinsburg High School

During third quarter, all 11th-grade students at Twinsburg High School participated in a two-part resume writing workshop designed to prepare them for future employment, internships, and scholarship opportunities. The program focused on building essential career readiness skills and helping students create their first polished, professional resumes. In the first session, students learned the purpose and impact of a resume, exploring how a well-crafted document can open doors to jobs, internships, volunteer positions, and academic awards. The discussion also emphasized digital professionalism, encouraging students to consider how their social media activity—posts, tags, and likes—can influence their reputation with future employers and scholarship committees. The second session provided hands-on resume development. Students created their first professional resumes and compiled reference documents highlighting part-time work, volunteer experience, school involvement, and academic achievements. Throughout the quarter, Ms. Toni Cluse, CVCC Career Specialist, reviewed and edited over 300 student resumes, providing individualized feedback to ensure each one was polished and professional. Juniors not enrolled in English 11 will also meet one-on-one with Ms. Cluse to complete their resumes. By the conclusion of the initiative, every junior at Twinsburg High School will have a strong, career-ready resume and a deeper understanding of professional expectations in today's competitive job market. The workshops not only provided students with a valuable tool for their immediate future but also reinforced the importance of professionalism, communication, and responsible digital citizenship.



Twinsburg High School and CVCC Celebrate Career Pathways

At Twinsburg High School, preparing students for life after graduation is a top priority. Each year, seniors share their post-graduation plans at a special signing event, celebrating the many pathways available to graduates. Twinsburg Eighth-Graders Explore Career Pathways

During the week of March 10–11, Twinsburg Middle School welcomed Toni Cluse, Career Specialist for the Twinsburg City School District, into all eighth-grade Social Studies classrooms to introduce students to career exploration. Through the district’s partnership with the CVCC, students revisited the Holland Personality Codes to learn how their individual strengths and interests can guide them toward meaningful career pathways. Students completed a Holland Personality Assessment to identify their three-letter Holland Code—such as Realistic, Investigative, Artistic, Social, Enterprising, or Conventional—which reflects personal interests and work preferences. They then discussed how these personality traits connect to potential careers and support informed planning for the future. The lessons also included a preview of CVCC through a video tour, highlighting the building layout, lab spaces, and program areas. This early exposure helps students visualize the hands-on technical and academic programs available at CVCC and consider which pathways align with their interests. By engaging students at this stage, Twinsburg Middle School and CVCC are helping young learners make informed choices about high school programs and post-secondary plans, reinforcing the value of career-connected learning.




Twinsburg High School Launches Mock Interview Program

Toni Cluse, Career Specialist for Twinsburg High School, introduced a new, high-impact Mock Interview program this year to prepare students for real-world hiring experiences. On March 16, the first half of an 80-student group participated in multiple one-on-one interview rounds, simulating professional hiring processes. This program builds on a multi-year effort, including a two-part resume workshop and “World of Work” clinic during students’ junior year. By rotating through different interviewers (including CVCC Career Specialists and local business leaders) students receive varied feedback to strengthen their skills and work toward earning the Ohio Means Jobs (OMJ) Readiness Seal. The initiative has already shown promising results, with the final round scheduled for March 24.

Computer Science Career Exploration at Nordonia High School

Students at Nordonia High School recently had the chance to explore the world of computer science with Mikhail Nesterenko, PhD, Professor and Chair of the Department of Computer Science at Kent State University. Since earning his doctorate in 1998, Dr. Nesterenko has been a dedicated faculty member, teaching courses like Computer Science III: Programming Patterns, an advanced programming class. During his visit, he shared insights from his academic and professional journey, highlighting his research in distributed algorithms, blockchain technology, and wireless networks, as well as his extensive publication record of over 70 research papers. The presentation offered students a glimpse into advanced computer science concepts and the many pathways available in higher education and research-driven careers. It inspired students to consider opportunities in computer science and related fields, emphasizing innovation, problem-solving, and lifelong learning. This career exploration experience was made possible through the support of Deb Monaco, CVCC Career Specialist for the Nordonia School District, and Samantha Fales, Chair of the Math Department, who continue to connect students with professionals to help guide informed career planning.



Nordonia Explores Career Opportunities with CVCC

Deb Monaco, CVCC Career Specialist for the Nordonia School District, recently visited eighth-grade social studies classes at Nordonia Middle School to introduce students to the opportunities available at CVCC. Students learned how exploring their interests now can help guide them toward exciting future career paths. With high school just around the corner, Ms. Monaco highlighted the many programs CVCC offers, including opportunities to earn college credits and industry certifications while still in high school. Students also completed personality assessments to discover their individual strengths and interests, helping them consider how their unique traits could align with one of CVCC's career-technical education programs.

Exploring Careers in the Electrical Trade at Nardon High School

Matt Capozzi, Training Director and Project Manager for the Akron Area Electrical Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee (JATC), recently visited Nardon High School to share career opportunities in the electrical trade. The presentation was organized by Deb Monaco, the district's Career Specialist, to help students explore pathways in this high-demand field. Mr. Capozzi walked students through the apprenticeship application process, employment rotations, and the competitive salaries and benefits offered in union electrical careers. He also highlighted the growing need for skilled electricians and the strong earning potential for those entering the field. Students learned about exciting industry developments, including projects connected to the new Cleveland Browns stadium, which will require both inside and high-voltage electricians. Mr. Capozzi encouraged students to consider electrical careers if they enjoy hands-on work, understand the physical demands of the job, and have an interest in emerging technologies shaping the industry.



Nardon Students Explore Skilled Trades at Cleveland Builds Fair

Deb Monaco, CVCC Career Specialist for the Nardon School District, and School Counselor Anthony Rock recently took Nardon High School students to the Cleveland Builds Skilled Trades Fair on March 13. The event introduces students to careers in the skilled trades and Architecture, Construction, and Engineering (ACE) fields. Students participated in hands-on exhibits, watched live demonstrations, and explored a variety of in-demand careers, including bricklaying, masonry, carpentry, drywall finishing, electrical work, floor covering, glazing, ironworking, insulation, painting, operating engineering, pile driving, pipefitting, plumbing, roofing, and sheet metal work. The visit also provided students the opportunity to connect with experienced tradespeople and contractors, learning about apprenticeship, pre-apprenticeship, and internship programs available after graduation.
