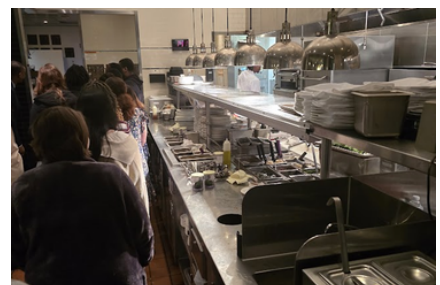
Power Equipment Technology Truck Delivered by Alumni

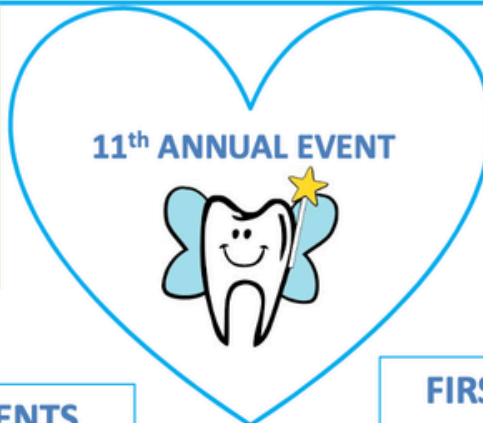

CVCC Adult Education Receives Above and Beyond Award

Congratulations to CVCC Adult Education for receiving the Above and Beyond Award at the OACTE PACE/OTDN Spring Conference! Pictured is Diane Duryea, CVCC's Business Liaison, who has significantly expanded our Customized Training programs. In Fiscal Year 2025, offerings increased by 500% compared to FY24, serving 270 employees. Already this year, training has grown by more than 90%, reaching over 385 individuals. Since joining CVCC three years ago, Diane has grown the machining apprenticeship program and expanded training opportunities at the local union hall. What began as HVAC training has evolved into a wide range of offerings, including electrical, survival skills, cheese making, cooking, and more. Diane has also broadened CVCC's client base to include state and federal organizations. She has partnered with the local Educational Service Center to provide TechCred training for educators and secured unique contracts, including training for the elves at Cuyahoga Valley National Park's North Pole Adventure. Additionally, CVCC now offers customer service training for National Park employees. Through her strong relationships and outreach, Diane has secured numerous scholarships for adults enrolled in training programs. She is currently working to expand CVCC's adult education offerings to local Catholic high schools in areas such as Nurse Aide and HVAC. CVCC is grateful for Diane's contributions and the lasting impact she continues to make on our students, business partners, and community.



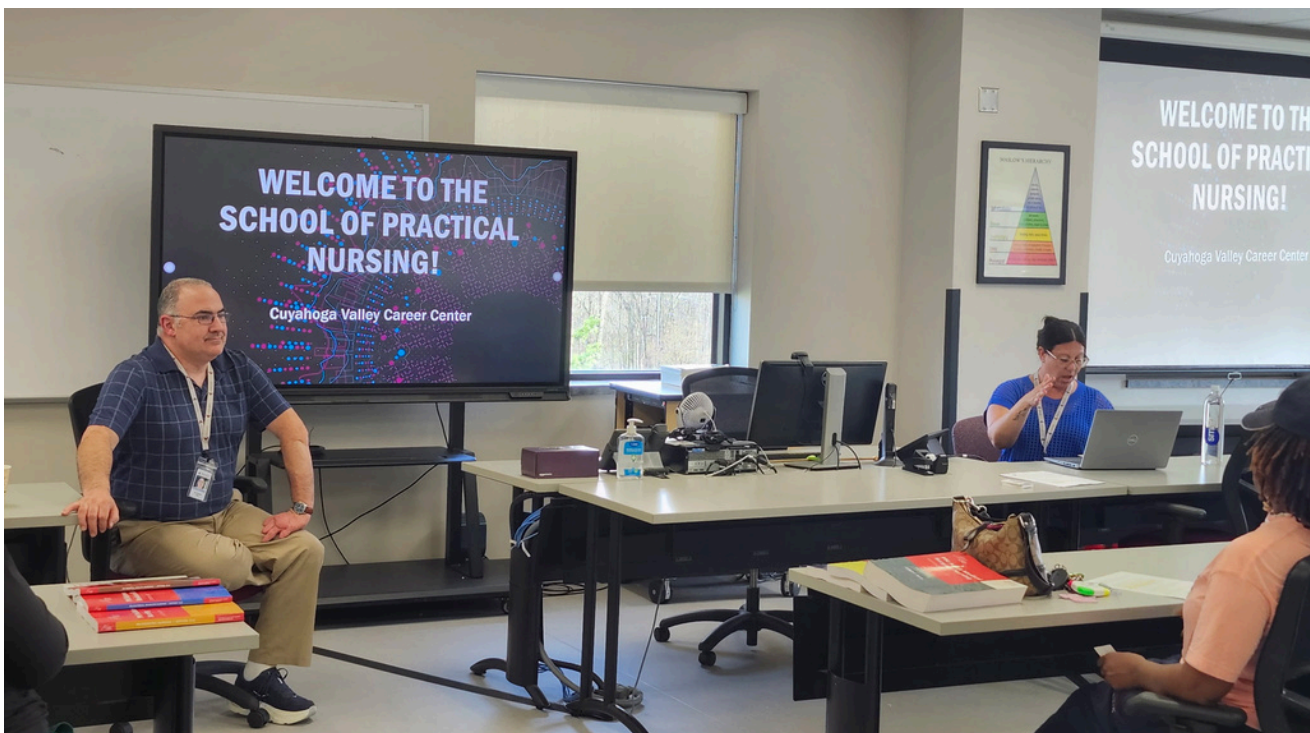
CVCC School of Nursing Open House

The session gave students a clearer understanding of how CVCC's Adult Education programs can serve as a direct pathway to rewarding careers.



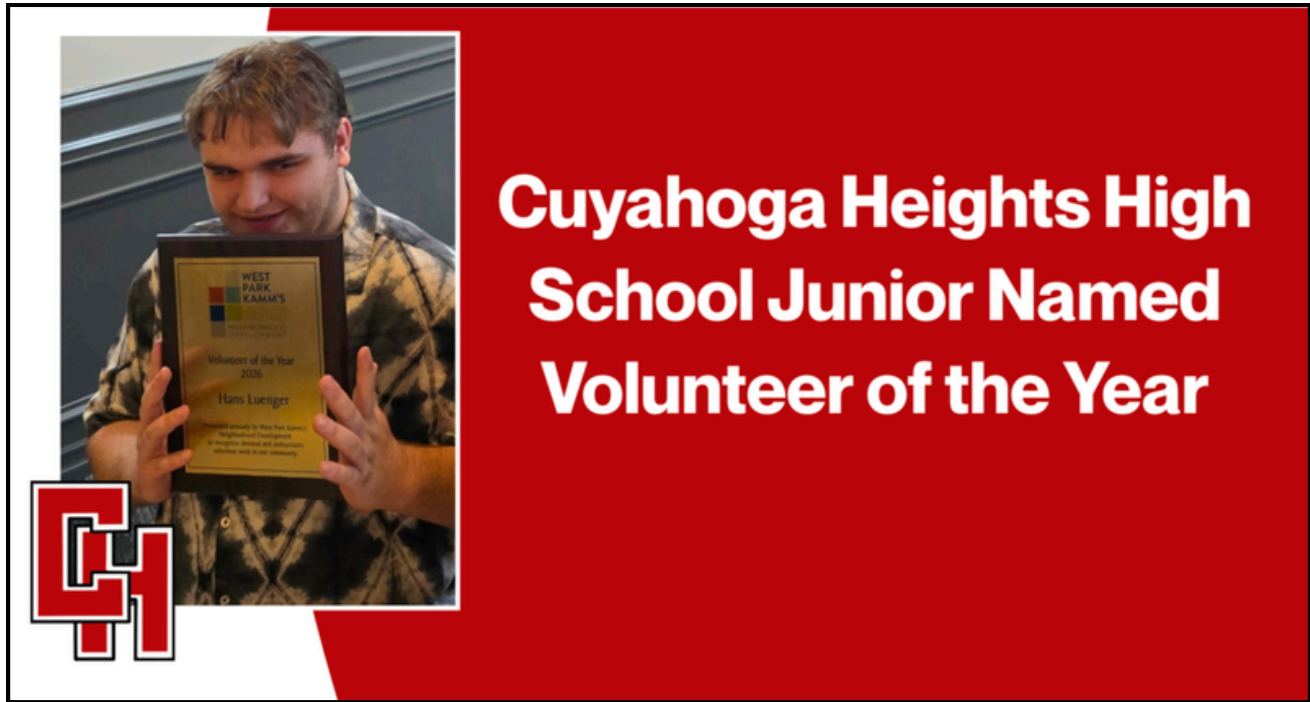
Court Reporting Duo Visits Nordonia High School

On April 1, Deb Monaco, Career Specialist for the Nordonia School District, welcomed two industry professionals to speak with students about career opportunities in court reporting. Sara Williams, Program Director for Captioning and Court Reporting at Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C), and Carla Kuhn, Official Court Reporter for the Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas, shared their expertise with students interested in exploring this high-demand field. Kuhn provided an in-depth look at the court reporting profession, highlighting the role of Communication Access Realtime Translation (CART) and its importance in ensuring accessibility for individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing. A Certified Realtime Reporter since 2006, Kuhn also earned the prestigious Registered Diplomat Reporter designation in 2022—an honor held by only the top 3% of court reporters nationwide. Williams emphasized the growing demand for court reporters and the significant shortage currently impacting the industry. She outlined the educational pathways available through Tri-C, including an associate degree program and a nine-month certification option designed to prepare students for immediate entry into the workforce. Students were especially intrigued to learn about the competitive salaries and strong job outlook associated with the profession. To help students explore this career path further, Williams also shared that Tri-C offers a free, four-week online introductory course, providing a valuable opportunity for those interested in determining if court reporting is the right fit for them.



Cuyahoga Heights High School/CVCC Student Named Volunteer of the Year
